

# Maude M. Halterman Dies in Ely, Nev., Buried Here Monday

Funeral services were held on Monday at 2 p. m. in the Third Ward chapel for Maude Mitchell Halterman, 53, former resident of Parowan, who died last Friday morning in an Ely, Nev. hospital following a long illness.

The services were conducted by Bishop Verl Taylor with Mrs. Itha Mortensen at the organ for prelude and postlude music. The prayer at the home of Mrs. Alice Halterman where the body lay prior to the services, was offered by Lyle O. Halterman.

Speakers for the occasion were W. Clair Rowley and J. Harold Mitchell, with closing remarks by Bishop Taylor. The poem, "En Voyhee" was read by Mrs. Marguerite Orton.
